To understand sacred and poetic life. Read SACRED, then POETIC, then CREATOR.

To understand material reality. Read ECON, then BEST, then GEO.

To understand the aesthetic and sonic character. Read AESTH, then MUS, then POETIC.

Condensed closing definition. The Master Canon Index is the navigation spine of the Lytherra library. It does not replace the primary volumes. It tells the reader where the world already speaks clearly, where concepts cross from one shelf into another, and where the canon remains deliberately unfinished so later work can deepen it without contradiction.
